Overall Report of Student Satisfaction Survey

The following is an analysis of the survey responses received for the Student Satisfaction Survey:

Maximum students feel that the teachers complete the syllabus well in time and come satisfactorily prepared to class and their communication skills are always effective. Most of the students feel the teacher's approach and attitude of teaching the topic is very good. The concepts taught are always well supplemented with added knowledge, examples and repetitions and when required. Most students agree that the institution involves the students in the quality of teaching learning process.

Most students feel that maximum number of teachers use ICT tools to enhance the teaching- learning process and the teaching-learning modules are very good. Many of the students feel that the evaluation process of the units test and assignments is always fair and there is a proper feedback system in place where the teachers always discuss with the students their performance and take regular follow-up of assigned tasks. Maximum students feel that the teachers always identify their strengths and weaknesses and encourage them to improve further.

Most of the students are of the opinion that they adequately encouraged participating in the co-curricular activities organized by the staff of the college. Maximum students feel that the teachers satisfactorily aid and help in providing a holistic development through the mentoring system and proper guidance. Maximum students are of the opinion that they are encouraged to participant in extra-curricular activities.

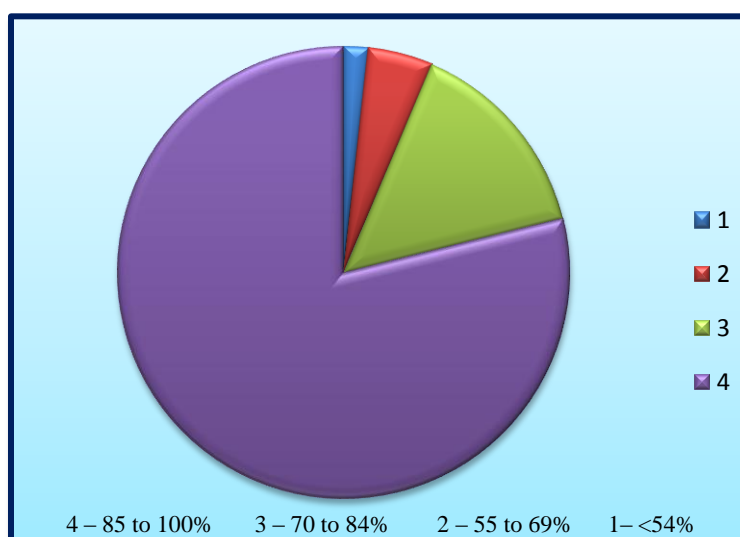

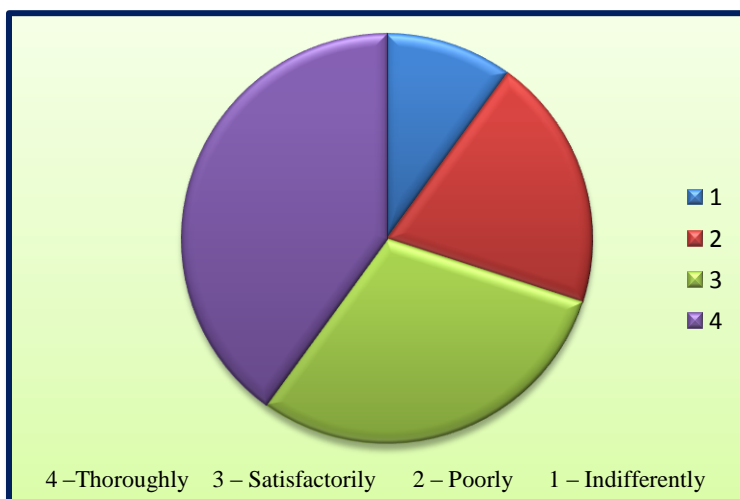
1. How much of the syllabus was covered in the class?

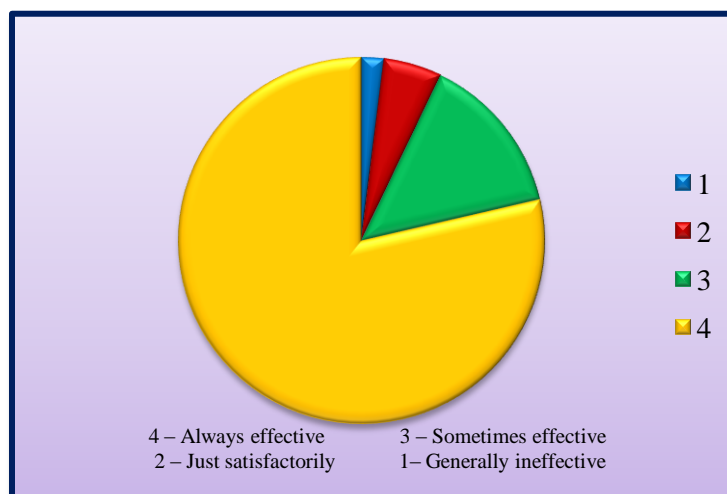
2. How well did the teachers prepare for the classes?

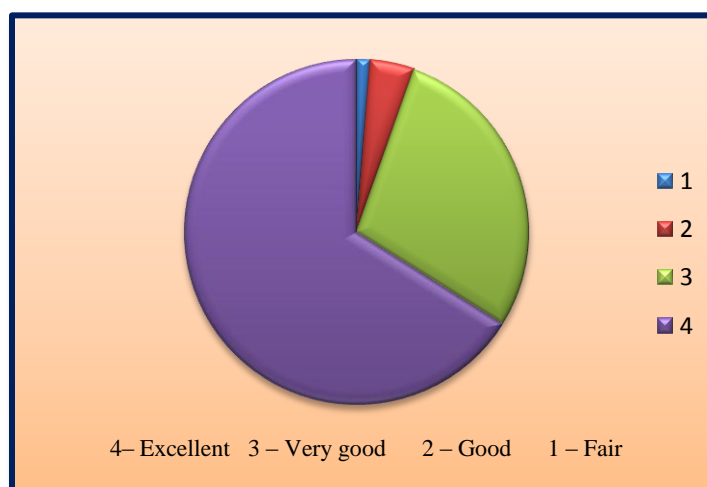
3. How well were the teachers able to communicate?

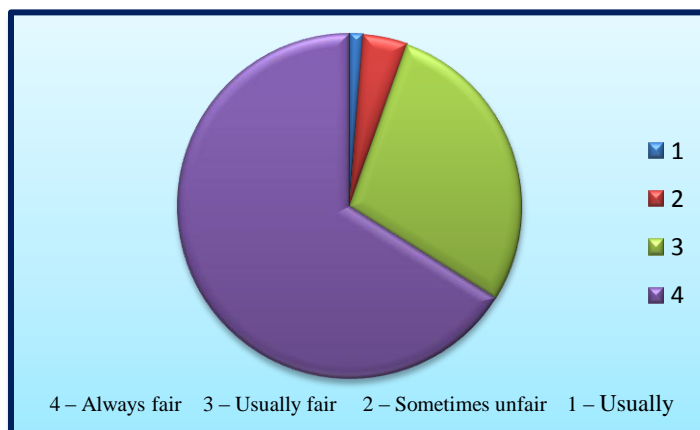
4. The teacher's approach to teaching can best be described as

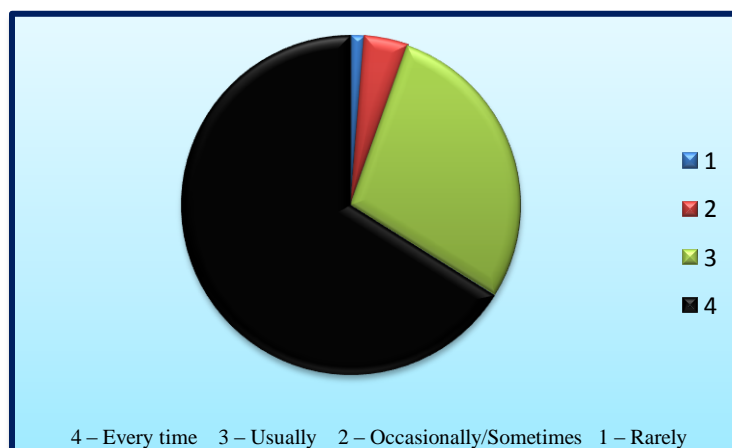
5. Fairness of the internal evaluation process by the teachers.

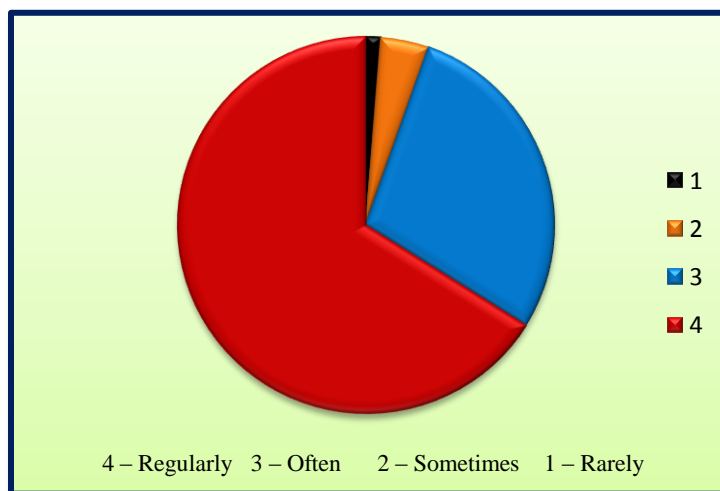
6. Was your performance in assignments discussed with you?

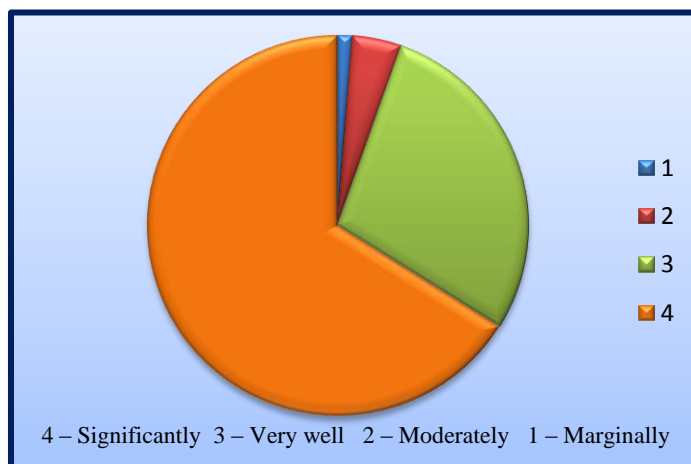
7. The institute takes active interest in promoting internship, student exchange, field visit opportunities for students.

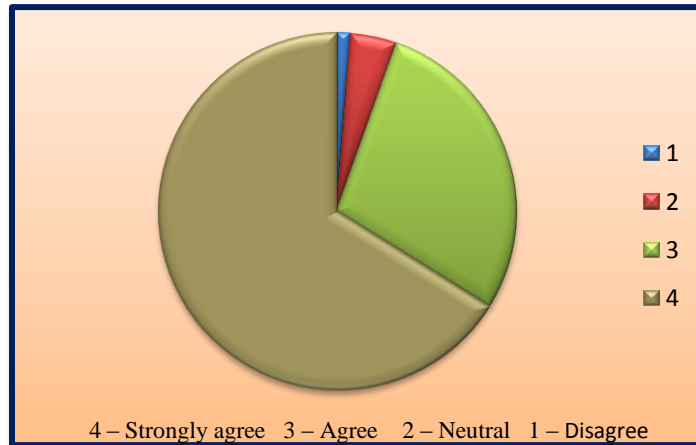
8. The teaching and mentoring process in your institution facilitates you in cognitive, social and emotional growth.

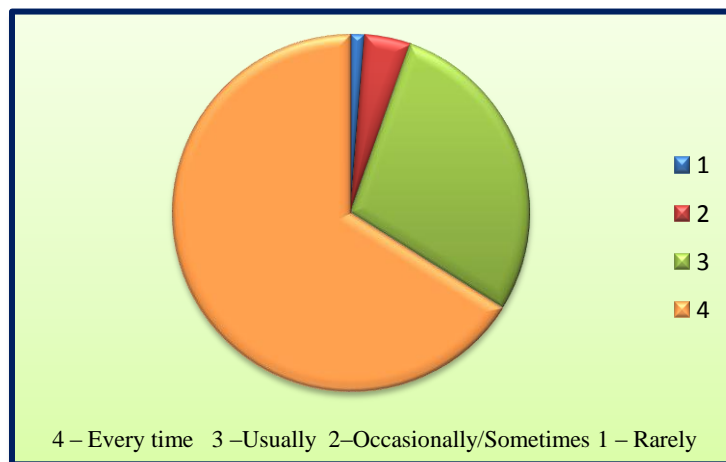
9. The institution provides multiple opportunities to learn and grow.

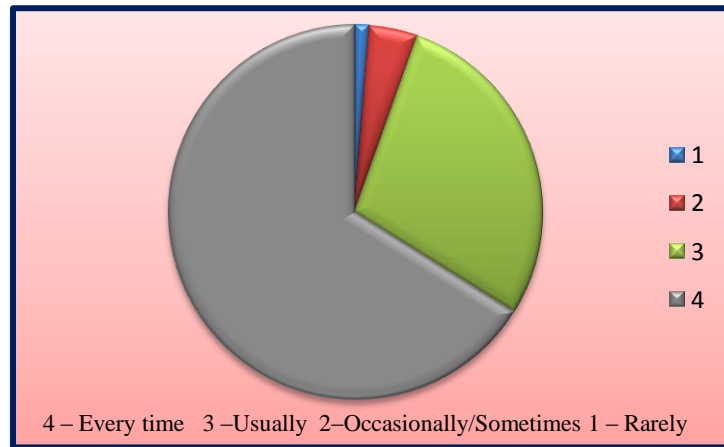

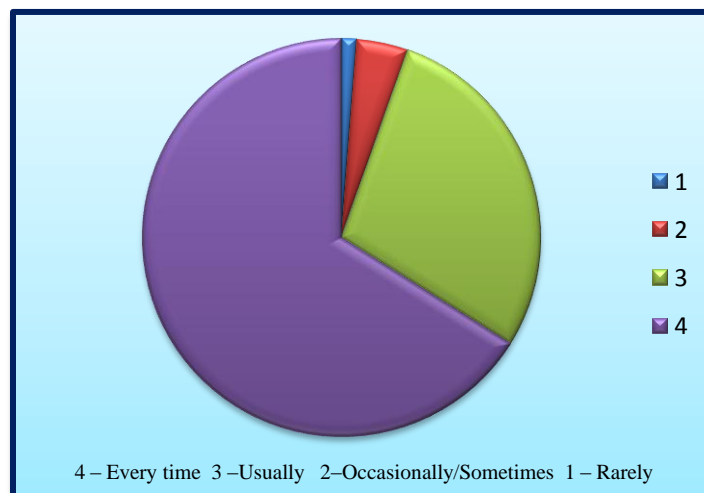
11. Your mentor does a necessary follow-up with an assigned task to you.

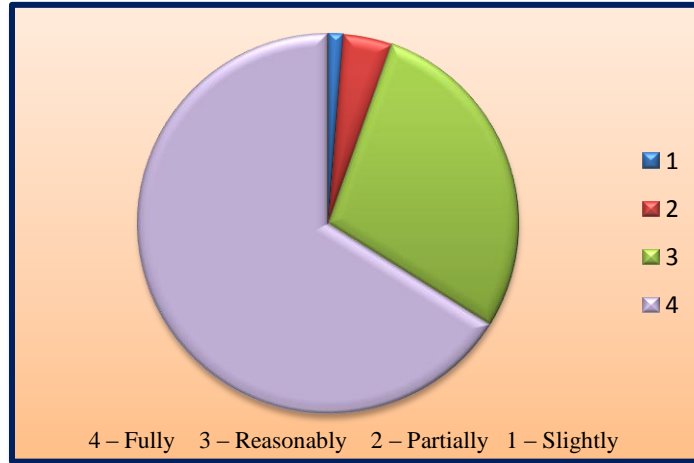
12. The teachers illustrate the concepts through examples and applications.

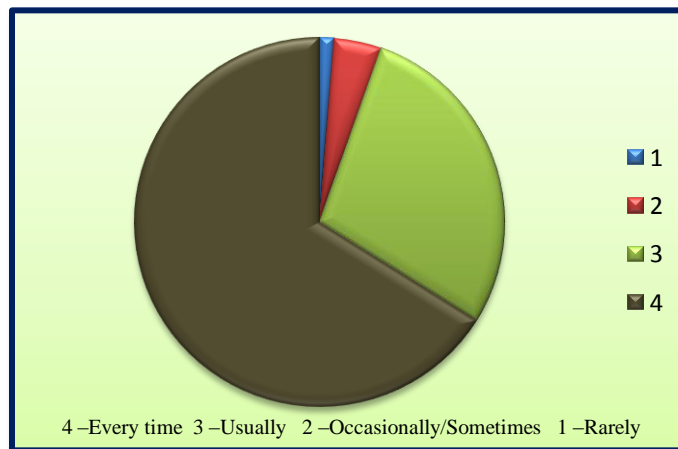

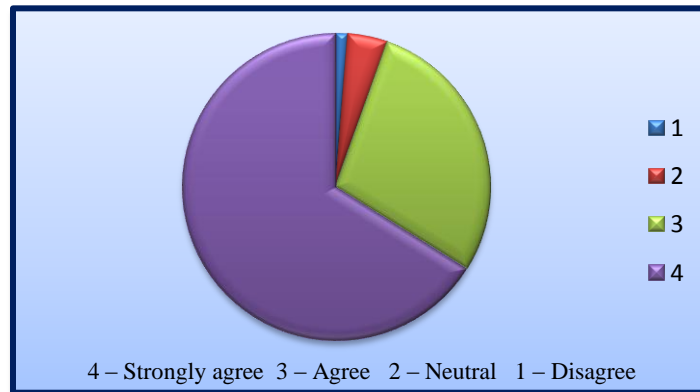

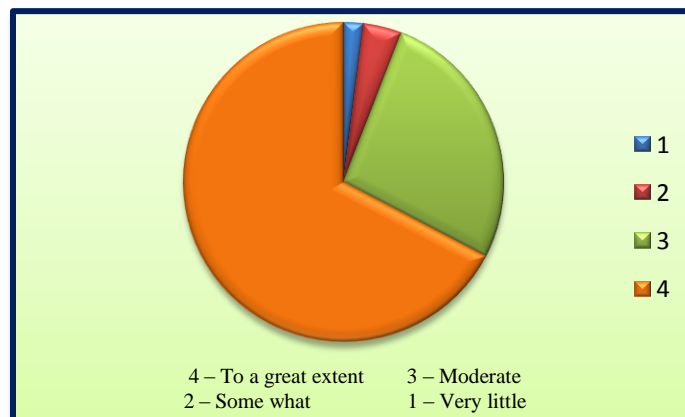
15. The institution makes effort to engage students in the monitoring, review and continuous quality improvement of the teaching learning process.

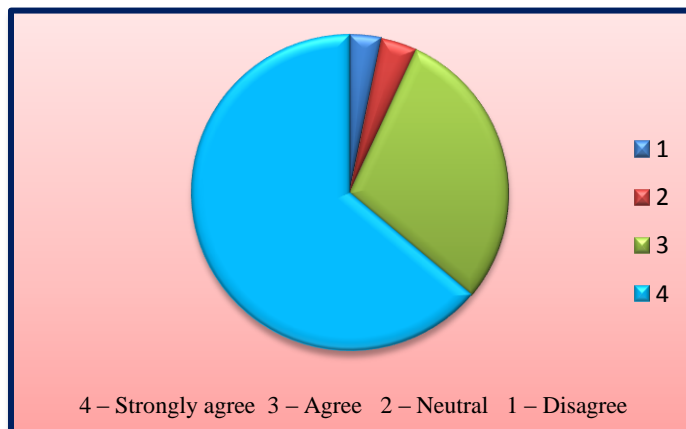

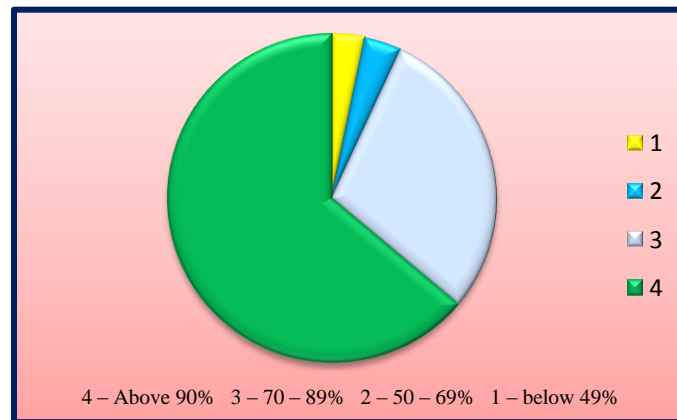

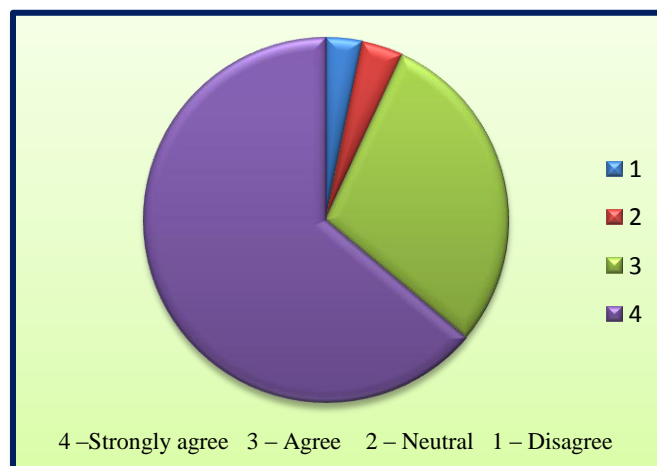
19. What percentage of teachers use ICT tools such as LCD projector, Multimedia, etc. while teaching.
